Adopt a Classroom Dinner update: Ben Ream and Stephanie Greene

SKNBC Membership Report: LeeAnne Smith

- 1) Two hundred and fifty of the welcome bags have been printed. The problem now is the SKNBC and each neighborhood association needs to come up how and to who the bags will be distributed along with where to store them.
- 2) LeeAnne and Heather will check to see about dues as they are due in July.

Election of President/Treasurer:

President's Report: Kelley DeLuca

- 1) Overgrown Foliage: Although there does seem to be some improvement on the foliage at the corner of Ellis and Woodlawn, Kelley will continue to call 311 about the problem.
- 2) Kelley has drafted a letter to the Office of Engineering for a landing pad at the intersection of Southwood and Woodlawn, and eventually will ask for a crosswalk at that intersection to hopefully begin traffic calming efforts on Woodlawn.
- 3) New Wordpress Website: At the last meeting it was voted to not renew the website because the hosting and domain charges were unsustainable. Stephanie Greene exported the information and was able to set up a free Wordpress website. She impressed on the group to upgrade the free website to a paid version which is only \$48 dollars a year so we can get our domain name back along with other added bonus features. Ann Viera made a motion to upgrade the website and pay with donations to LFNA. Becky Wade seconded the motion and the motion passed.
- 4) USA Cycling National Championships: There will be road closures in South Knoxville the weekend of June 22-24th.
- 5) Urban Wilderness: There will be another meeting with the Mayor about the Urban Wilderness connections on June 25th.
