Dogwood Elementary School Update: Adam Fritts and Kara Strouse

1. Adam is no longer the site coordinator at Dogwood Elementary, although he is still working with the school and other local schools. The new coordinator is Kara Strouse.
2. REI awarded Tennessee Mountain Biking Club a grant of about \$10,000. With that money they extended the Dogwood trail from the school to Stanley Lippencott Park(SLP). The group Bike, Walk, Knoxville would like to start a walking school bus from the new apartments being built soon near SLP to Dogwood.
3. Adam thanked LFNA for adopting the CDC classroom.

SKNBC Membership Report: LeeAnne Smith

1. Local events: South Knoxville Alliance fundraiser, Run with the Goats September 30th at the big farm on Tipton Station Road. \$30 registration fee will cover obstacle course with goats, a t-shirt, and feeding goats. \$35 registration on the day of the event.
2. Neighborhood Welcome Bags
 - a. 250 bags printed to be distributed between 10 neighborhoods.
 - b. Looking for business donations to be able to print more bags in the future.
 - c. If anyone wants to purchase a bag, they will be available for \$15.

Task List:

1. Kelley was able to get all the LFNA officers to sign the letter she drafted to the city engineering department about installing a landing pad at Southwood and Woodlawn. The letter has been mailed to the Director of Engineering, but there has been no response at this time.
2. Once the exact placement of the speed humps is known, neighbors will ask for approval from the owners of the adjacent properties. Once approval is given, Engineering can move forward with the installation.
3. Kelley is currently drafting a letter to the owners of the property at the corner of Southwood and Woodlawn to ask them to keep the property in better repair or sell so a new owner can keep the property up.

Other: National Night Out is in October. Dogwood is planning on doing an Open Play Day at the soccer field. Kelley suggested we combine our National Night Out activity with the Open Play Day.

Executive Inn Strategy: Kelley is meeting with Councilwoman Stephanie Welch to see about having a sit down meeting with the owners of the Executive Inn. Also it was suggested that we have a neighborhood clean up and help clean up some of the trash and garbage around the Executive Inn.

Neighborhood Sign Update: The application is in and has been approved. Next Engineering will come out and inspect the sites. The signs, themselves, are being carved by hand, and, therefore, will take a while to be made.
